

Capital Cup pits executives in fundraising golf match

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Two dozen Sacramento executives will compete in a three-day Sacramento Capital Cup golf tournament to raise money for charity.

The region hosts many golf tournaments -- and many raise money for charity -- but the Sacramento Capital Cup is on an entirely different scale: The goal is to raise a total of \$150,000.

It will raise some money for 24 charities, and the charity represented by the tournament's winning team will split \$50,000.



The tournament runs Oct. 2 through Oct. 4, with the first day at El Macero Country Club in Davis, the second day at Winchester Country Club in Meadow Vista and the final at Granite Bay Country Club. The final will be open to the public with a full gallery for spectators.

“We are excited to bring together such an influential group of leaders in the spirit of making a difference for our community,” said Curt Rocca, managing partner at DCA, which is organizing the event.

The tournament will follow a Ryder Cup format, with two teams competing. The teams will be selected randomly by team captains Rocca and Kerry Gordon of Moss Adams LLP.

Each of the 24 executives participating in the Sacramento Capital Cup has to pay a \$2,500 buy-in and also raise or donate \$4,500 for the prize pool. There is a twist to the tournament. Players get a mulligan for every \$2,500 raise -- up to a limit of four. A mulligan is a do-over for a bad stroke or a bad shot. The list of executives participating will be posted on a website next week. There are only a few spots remaining, said Jairo Moncada, spokesman for the Sacramento Capital Cup.
